

## **Obituary – Alan Davidson, Ph.D.**

Dr. Alan Davidson, died December 7, 2011 of a heart attack in his Mission Hills, CA home. Al was 64 years old. Private services were held and he is interred at the El Camino Memorial Park in San Diego. He is survived by his wife Lynette.

Al transferred from San Mateo HS, where he was on the football and swim teams and student council. At BHS, he was active on the Order Commission and Swim Team. He represented BHS as a school delegate to the MPL Conference and in the Lions Club Speech Contest.

Al was our Sr. Class President in Spring, 1965. His outside interests included the Artsians Hi-Y and he was a member of the HI-Y Council during his senior year. Alan stated for the BHS '65 yearbook that he would always remember "dissecting the cat in Biology and Mr. MacCuish's great inspirational effect." He was often seen driving and tinkering on his TR-3 sports car.

Following his years at Burlingame, Al's education included:

- San Diego State University - Clinical Psychology
- University of Cincinnati College of Medicine
